<p>Purpose of role: The Senior Lecturer in Fashion Design is responsible for pedagogic development, teaching and learning, student welfare, course development, resource management and on-going scholarship on the BA (Hons) Fashion Design Technology: Womenswear course. This course is part of the Fashion Programme in the School of Design and Technology at London College of Fashion. The post-holder will work collaboratively within a course team, deploying specialist expertise to develop pedagogy and the curriculum in innovative and critical directions.</p> <p>The post-holder will be expected to undertake:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pedagogic and curriculum development that stimulate thought and practice that challenge the canon of fashion design • Strategic planning of pastoral care and community building within the student cohort • Responsibility for undergraduate students' pastoral support, progress and attendance, maintaining records and liaising with colleagues as appropriate • Promote diversity and inclusivity in teaching and learning on the course • Expand the capacity of the course design to meet the need to support student centred learning and recognition of the course values both internally and externally. <p>This responsibility is of immediate strategic importance and may develop or change in the light of new priorities.</p> <p>The post-holder is expected to uphold and implement the policies and procedures of University of the Arts London and the College.</p>	
<p>Duties and responsibilities:</p> <p><i>Teaching:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To undertake teaching as appropriate to your areas of expertise and the subject areas of the Course, Programme or College. • To stay abreast of research and other developments in Fashion Design education and to ensure that these developments are reflected in the curriculum in consultation with colleagues and within the structures and mechanisms established by the University and the College. • To extend the level of subject expertise and critical understanding on the Course so as to keep the curriculum at the forefront of critical, creative and professional practice, relevant to a diverse and international range of students. • To conduct assessment both formative and summative, which is rigorous, fair and clear and complies with the policies established by the University and the College. • To lead the organisation of assessment for all stages ensuring rigour and parity across the course • To provide both academic and pastoral support to students, develop a strong course community, monitor progress and attendance, and maintain appropriate records. <p><i>Professional</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To initiate or engage in pedagogic inquiry and teaching development as required with the specific focus of improving student engagement, experience and attainment. 	

- To participate in student feedback processes, in consultation with the course team and course leader, respond to the issues raised through this engagement.
- To devise and organise activities for the course team that contribute to the strategic development of the course design and pedagogy in consultation with the Course Leader.
- In consultation with the Course Leader, to liaise with other staff to enhance and extend the educational and creative links between BA (Hons) Fashion Design Technology: Womenswear and other courses across the Programme, College and University.
- To undertake scholarly activity (including research, knowledge exchange or teaching) relevant to the subject of fashion design.
- To contribute to the devising and delivery of activities (including income generation) which will benefit students' educational experience and graduate outcomes.

- To contribute to strategic planning in relation to the course/programme in areas such as student recruitment, the deployment of resources, research and knowledge exchange
- To lead curriculum design developments in the context of revalidation, in consultation with the course leader, in order to further strategic objectives at course and college level
