Purpose of Role:

- To undertake teaching, unit management, curriculum development and research within the subject specialism of journalism studies.
- To undertake the role of Year Tutor on BA (Hons) Journalism, taking responsibility for the management and coordination of that area, and other related duties as determined by the Course and/or Programme Director.
- To take on unit leadership and teaching responsibilities for Theoretical/Contextual Studies and Dissertations.
- To play an active role in the department's research profile.
