Purpose of Role:

The post holder will contribute to the BA Bespoke Tailoring programme undertake teaching, assessment, unit management, curriculum development and research.

Working collaboratively, the post holder will be required to deliver lectures and workshops on tailoring and related studies underpinned by knowledge of pattern cutting for menswear and current bespoke tailoring techniques, technology and craft innovation.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- To undertake a teaching programme, providing both academic and pastoral support to students, monitoring progress and attendance and maintaining appropriate records.
- To contribute to lesson planning, teaching, assessing, course review and curriculum development.

- To contribute to research, scholarly activity and or professional practice both individually and through appropriate subject related groups.

- To provide support for the Course Leader and Programme Director in the management of the programme of teaching and assessment in tailoring and related academic studies within the course.
- To support the process of reviewing tailoring units and contributing to the identification and validation of new units.
