Job Description

Purpose of role

The Diploma in Professional Studies (DPS) is an optional year out in industry between the second and fourth year of a 4 year undergraduate course within CCW. The DPS offers students within CCW the opportunity to undertake up to five placements within the academic year.

The post holder will oversee the introduction and preparation stage of the DPS for Fine Art students, delivering lectures, seminars and 1:1 tutorials. They will advise students on placement opportunities and sign off placement paperwork. During the



placement year the post holder will offer support and regular 1:1 tutorials and mentoring to students, as well as monitoring progress and running group seminars. The post holder will assess and feedback student progress, both formative and summative.

The post-holder will work collaboratively with the CCW Diploma in Professional Studies development team and the School of Fine Art across Chelsea and Camberwell, deploying specialist expertise to develop pedagogy and external industry links in innovative and critical directions.



Purpose of role

The post-holder will be expected to undertake –

- Responsibility for the Fine Art Diploma in Professional Studies students'
 pastoral support, progress and attendance, maintaining records and liaising
 with colleagues as appropriate.
- Pedagogic and curriculum development of industry placement learning that stimulate thought and practice that challenge the canon of fine art with the aim of promoting diversity and inclusivity.
- Develop external industry links and relationships.

This responsibility is of immediate strategic importance and may develop or change in the light of new priorities.

The post-holder is expected to uphold and implement the policies and procedures of University of the Arts London and the College.

Duties and Responsibilities

Teaching:

- To give operational and strategic leadership to the Diploma in Professional Studies within the School of Fine Art.
- To be responsible for the preparation, tutoring, support, monitoring and evaluation of the Diploma in Professional Studies within the School of Fine Art.
- To undertake teaching as appropriate to your areas of expertise and the subject areas of the Course, Programme or College.
- To stay abreast of research and other developments in industry learning and to ensure that these developments are reflected in the curriculum in consultation with colleagues and within the structures and mechanisms established by the University and the College.



- To extend the level of subject expertise and critical understanding on the Course so as to keep the curriculum at the forefront of industry professional practice and relevant to a diverse and international range of students.
- To conduct assessment, formative and summative, which is rigorous, fair and clear and complies with the policies established by the University and the College.
- To provide both academic and pastoral support to students, monitoring progress and attendance, and maintaining appropriate records.

Professional

- To initiate or engage in pedagogic inquiry and teaching development as required with the specific focus of improving student engagement, experience and progression.
- To participate in the engagement of students in feedback processes, and in consultation with the course team and course leader, respond to the issues raised through this engagement.
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- In consultation with the course leader, to liaise with other staff to enhance and extend the educational and creative links between the course and other courses across the Programme, College and University.
- To undertake scholarly activity relevant to the subject
- To contribute to the devising and delivery of activities (including income generation) which will benefit students' educational experience and graduate outcomes.
- To be familiar with debates and research relating to decolonising the curriculum and awarding gaps within the HE Sector.



Quality, Management and Enhancement

- To contribute to strategic planning in relation to the course/programme in areas such as student recruitment, the deployment of resources, research and knowledge exchange.
- To lead curriculum design developments in the context of revalidation, in consultation with the course leader, in order to further strategic objectives at course and college level.
- To contribute to the monitoring of the quality of teaching and learning through continuous course monitoring and to contribute to quality, management and enhancement activities across the School, College and University.
- To be a member of the Course Committee of the Course and of such other committees, including other course committees and examination boards, as the Dean of School or Head of College require.

General

- To perform such duties consistent with your role as may from time to time be assigned to you anywhere within the University.
- To undertake health and safety duties and responsibilities appropriate to the role.
- To work in accordance with the University's Staff Charter and Dignity at Work Policy, promoting equality, diversity and inclusion in your work.
